

Chevron Engineering Project Management Fellowships

Case Studies in Eng. Project Management

Purpose and Goal

The purpose of the Chevron Corporation Project Management Fellowship is to identify outstanding engineering students who are interested in learning more about project management and getting them engaged in teaching, research, campus-outreach activities, and other community-based projects.

The goal of the Case Studies in Engineering Project Management program is to provide a financial support for graduate students and faculty from all engineering disciplines in developing and documenting project case studies. While these project case studies could come from different technical areas, the emphasis should be given to application of project management methods and tools to solve the technical issues and overcome execution challenges, rather than on providing technical (discipline-specific) analysis and solutions.

Funding

Each fellowship will be \$5,000 and will be for partial support of the student for one full academic semester (i.e. Spring 2018).

Requirements

1. Each student applicant should submit: a) completed application form, as well as b) 2 page proposal that reflects the method, data, and the timeline for developing the project management case study.
2. Each student Fellow will be required to participate in 2-hour training session for developing materials for teaching case studies as well as prepare and give one or more oral presentations describing the Fellow's case study development process to classes, to Chevron representatives, and to others.
3. Each student Fellow is required to submit the final report (due June 1, 2017) that includes the case study itself, as well as describes the process used for the developing the case study.
4. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents.

Application Process Timeline

1. Each student applicant should submit the complete application package before November 15, 2017 to the award committee chair at: idamnjanovic@tamu.edu
2. The email submissions should include the following text in subject line: CHEVRON FELLOWSHIP APPLICATION.
3. Announcements of awards for the Spring 2018 semester will be made in early January 2018.

The proposal should include at minimum the following sections: short case study project description, available data, relevancy to project management, case study development method and the timeline for completion of the study.
